A departure from the cone of awkward silence and shame that so often surrounds sexual health, *Strange Bedfellows* is the straight-shooting book about the consequences of sex that all curious readers have been looking for.

The book also explores a cycle of behavior that clinicians can personalize and use as a template for treatment. In its final sections, the book focuses on counter-transferential responses and the different ways in which therapists can work with self-destructive behaviors and avoid vicarious traumatization by adopting tools and strategies for self-care. *Treating Self-Destructive Behaviors in Trauma Survivors, 2nd ed.*, can be used on its own or in conjunction with the accompanying client-focused workbook, *Letting Go of Self-Destructive Behaviors: A Workbook of Hope and Healing*.
